- Attend all meetings of the CTA Aspiring Educators Board.
- Attend all statewide CTA Aspiring Educators events.
- Work directly with the local chapters and members in their region to provide resources, support, leadership, mentorship, and guidance.
- After consultation, the CTA Aspiring Educators Statewide Board may assign other duties, such as planning regional events.

The Racial Equity Affairs Committee Directors shall:


- Identify and monitor racial, ethnic and social justice concerns regarding educational issues and Association activities and report pertinent information to the CTA Aspiring Educators Statewide Board for action.
- Attend all meetings of the CTA Aspiring Educators Statewide Board.
- Focus on recruitment and retention of BIPOC and diverse educators.
- Serve as the co-chairs of the CTA Aspiring Educators Racial Equity Affairs Committee.
- Share all information concerning minority teaching incentives, programs and scholarships with the membership.
- Shall attend additional conferences.
 - CTA Equity and Human Rights Conference
 - CTA LGBTQ+ Issues Conference
- Be responsible for other duties as assigned by the Statewide Board or the Representative Assembly.
- Must identify as Black, Indigenous and/or People of Color (BIPOC) and/or LGBTQ+.


